From Our Pastor . . .

This summer, our children have played outside every evening until sundown. It is truly a wonderful thing. Riding their bikes, catching lightening bugs to put in a jar, dancing to the drumming of the cicadas and general imaginative play consume their daily moments up until daylight fades to night. But there is something about Caulder's play that has caught my attention.

The other day, as he was coming in from a long time outside playing, I noticed his fingernails. There was dirt under them. You can picture it: dirt caked up under his nails that makes the dark line visible from a distance. The kind of dirt that is not going to come out simply by washing his hands, we would have to clip his fingernails to get them clean. Like playing outside until sundown, this is not a bad thing. I love to see it!

But I got to thinking about it. I knew exactly what he had been doing to cause such dirt to rest up under those nails. He was digging in the dirt. I knew the spot where he'd been playing. I knew the toys with which he'd been playing. I knew the "game" he'd been playing. How? Because I had seen him in that spot with those toys playing that game so many times. He was in a spot beside the driveway that has no grass and he had his dumptruck and tractor, just digging in the dirt. I knew where he'd been and what he'd been doing by the evidence on his hands. And when I asked him about it, his response was, "Dad...I always play in the dirt with my dumptruck!"

The evidence of our lives is easy to see. Where we have been and what we have been doing always rise to the surface of our souls. It caused me to think about the evidence of being in the presence of God. There is no way to be with the Lord and come away unchanged. There is always evidence of being with God. For Moses, it was his glowing face – radiating the glory of God. For Peter, it is the miraculous power of God that moves through his shadow – because he is standing in the light of Christ. Paul describes keeping in step with the Holy Spirit in such a way that the evidence of the Spirit – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control – emanates from our lives like the sweet aroma of fresh fruit. In all of these instances, it is undeniable what has been happening.

It has caused me to ask myself, "what evidence is in my life that I have been with Jesus?" I am convinced that the more we are with Jesus, the more time we devote to drawing closer to Jesus, the deeper we talk with Jesus, the clearer the evidence becomes. It is worked into us by the power of the Holy Spirit like dirt under our fingernails. It is evident from across the room.

For several weeks now, the Holy Spirit has been bringing to mind the words of *John 1:1-5*. In speaking of the incarnation of God in Christ, John speaks of Jesus as the Word of God and as the Light of the world. In particular, what has held the attention of my soul are these words: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light." So, when we walk in the light of the Lord, the light will always shine. There will always be evidence. There will always be a signal pointing to in whose presence we have been. It is my prayer that as we, together as a congregation, draw closer into the presence of God, it will be evident – more and more each day – that we have been and dwell with the Lord. The best news of all is that the light of the presence of God will never be extinguished.
