#### From Our Pastor . . .

We sat on the beach, the sun blazing down upon us, and the gentle to-and-fro lapping of the tide splashing against our feet and watched our children as they played. The kids were back and forth between playing in the water and playing in the sand. They love the beach and each year, Ronna and I talk about how our children could stay out on the beach itself all day, every day while we are on vacation. Each year the beach vacation is a bit different, and this year was no exception. The kids really got the hang of boogie-boarding and building sandcastles.

One afternoon while on the beach, Annlyn was working on a sandcastle. She spent more than an hour working on it and was really making progress on it. She would call out from time to time, "Mom and dad...look at this!" But I noticed something: the longer she worked the further in the tide came. As the tide rose that afternoon, it inched closer and closer to her sandcastle. Eventually, with her back to the ocean, she felt the first gentle splash of the ocean water against her bare foot. The next wave that came up was, as you would expect, a bit stronger and began to wash around her sandcastle.

I felt bad for her because she worked so hard on the sandcastle, and she was so proud of it. But as soon as the water got close enough to wrap around her work of art, she could see what the waves were going to do and she abandoned her project, grabbed her boogie-board and went into the water to "ride the waves."

Through all of this, I could not help but think about a few things, though. I thought about what those waves do: they wash up and they wash away. The beach looks different every single day, depending on the flow of the tide. But even deeper than that, I thought about the parable Jesus tells at the end of the Sermon on the Mount. After moving through such profound and prophetic teaching, Jesus summarizes what it means to follow Him with the parable of the wise and foolish builders. Each builder builds a house, and each house has to stand against a storm. The difference is in the foundation. The house built on the rock does not wash away while the house built on the sand washes away easily (*Matthew 7:24-27*). While watching Annlyn's sandcastle give way to the ebb and flow of the tide, I heard the whisper of the Holy Spirit ask me to check the foundations of my life. Where is my life built? On the solid rock of following Jesus or on shifting sand?

When we allow Jesus to build His house, He will build it on the solid rock of himself. The rock-solid nature of Jesus is rooted and grounded in His death and His resurrection from the dead. And there is no storm, no wind, no wave, nothing that can wash away the reality or the power of the death and resurrection of Christ Jesus. What does it look like for our lives to be built like that? Well, a read through the Sermon on the Mount (*Matthew 5-7*) describes it to a tee. I am deeply, deeply grateful to God for this gift and the building power of the Holy Spirit.

For the record, I am not much of a beach-y kind of guy. I would much rather sit on the front porch and read a good book than go out on the beach for the day. But, I would not miss boogie-boarding, sandcastles, and the whispers of the Holy Spirit for anything!


