From Our Pastor . . .

I recently purchased a new bicycle to get more exercise and be a little healthier. When I bought it, the fellow at the bike shop commented and said, "having a bike you like to ride will make you want to ride more. The more you ride the more you want to ride." And in the last month of having the new bike, I have learned he was right. In fact, I have wanted to ride so much that the new bike went to the beach with us on vacation.

Nearly every morning I would get up and ride all over Oak Island, missing one day because of rain. The route was a little different each day, I would get up and make the decision to ride. I kept track of how far I was riding each day and was blown away to see that at the end of the two-week vacation, I'd logged more than 106 miles on that bike. At first, it was hard to get up in the morning while on vacation but once the habit was created, I actually looked forward to it. I loved the time riding through creation and though Oak Island is a very familiar place, everything looked different from the saddle of a bicycle. Each morning when I returned from the ride, Ronna and the kids were there to ask, "how many miles did you ride today?" and then offer encouragement to keep going. Once they learned I was headed for a goal of at least 100 miles, they kept saying, "You can do this, dad!"

The whole experience reinforced for me something very important: the need for healthy habits. Healthy habits are a good thing. Healthy habits bring about growth and lead to strength. They challenge us in good, productive, and fruitful ways. These habits need to be cultivated in our lives and it is good to have encouragement to keep focused and to allow the habits to produce good fruit.

The rhythm of the life of the disciple of Jesus is filled with these kinds of habits. Jesus speaks clearly in *John 15* about how He is the vine, and we are the branches, with the Father as the vinedresser. The intent of the vine is to bear much fruit and we, as disciples of Jesus, will bear much fruit if we remain connected to Him and He to us. These habits in the Christian life include prayer, time in the Word of God, worship, service, and a host of other things. Think about the fruit that is produced in your life through the Holy Spirit when you have spent time in deep prayer. Reflect on how much deeper you go with the Lord when you are spending time in His Word on a regular basis. There is no way to describe the depth of the move of the Holy Spirit when we open ourselves to worship.

While all of these healthy habits are possible to keep on our own, it is also important that we keep them together. And what is wonderful about our congregational life is the way we cultivate these healthy habits together as a church family. We encourage one another to keep it up, stay focused, and we rejoice together as the fruit-bearing habits take root and the Holy Spirit brings about new life. Each Sunday morning we gather for worship and for Bible Study. These are good habits to keep because we are engaged in them together. The preacher in Hebrews encourages the church to continue meeting together that we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds (*Hebrews 10:25*).

I want to encourage you to cultivate these good, healthy habits in your life. If you are new to our fellowship and have not joined a bible study class, or if you've simply not been to bible study in a while, join in a class. Make it a good habit. If you have not joined in a ministry to serve, take a look at the worship bulletin each week — and throughout the rest of this newsletter — to find ways to be involved in the ministry and service through the congregation. Each Sunday morning, give yourself to the worship of God with other believers. If you have questions about which bible study class might be a good fit, or about various ministries, please contact a member of the church staff and we will be glad to help. These things are great by ourselves and they are wonderful with one another.

With this new bike, I have been riding with a group of guys in Hickory a couple of times a week. As great as it was to ride solo on Oak Island, I missed riding with the group. There is something encouraging and challenging and unifying when cultivating a habit like this together.

We, as a church family, are bound to one another in Christ. We need one another. We worship, grow, study, and serve together. Let's enjoy this ride and watch as the Holy Spirit bears much fruit in our lives.

Viewmont, I want you to know just how much I love you and what a joy it is to be your pastor, your friend, and your brother in Christ....
