From Our Pastor . . .

It was first thing in the morning. All three children were ready for the day with bookbags, lunchboxes, masks, and an energized attitude ready to go. We were out the door, loaded in the car, and cruising down the road coming into Hickory. Now, mind you this was about six weeks ago, so it was before Halloween. The girls were asking questions about the upcoming series of celebrations – Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's, etc. With all the changes and instability, they were wondering what we would do. I told them I did not know yet, but we would figure it all out as we went along.

Then Annlyn asked about a very special Christmas tradition for our family. I had no idea she looked forward to it as much as she did. When I told her I did not know what we were going to do, she was a bit emotional. Then, she said, "Well, dad, that doesn't change Christmas at all!" My heart could have leapt out of my chest that morning. She was spot-on! It doesn't change Christmas at all.

I think everyone is wondering how in the world we will hold various traditions this year. What about this get-together and that party? What will we do with this tradition or that event? How are we supposed to hold Christmas this year? These are questions I have pondered a lot lately; for my own family and for our church family. I do believe the answer lies in the weeks that lead up to Christmas: Advent.

The season of Advent is one of anticipation. These four weeks are pregnant with expectation. It is a journey of hope, peace, joy, and love, finding the fullest fulfillment in the baby lying in a manger in Bethlehem. Indeed, it is there where "the hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight."

This year, maybe more than ever before in our lifetimes, we need to be reminded of the very center of the Advent journey. We need to journey back to Bethlehem to be held by hope, peace, joy, and love. As a congregation, the weeks of Advent will still feature the lighting of the candles and the public and corporate reading of the Word of God. But our focus will be on the tangibility of Advent. When we think about what Advent is and what it leads to, the incarnation of God in Christ Jesus is at the very core. Mary and Joseph *held* Jesus. The shepherds likely *held* the lamb of God. The magi could have *held* God's indescribable gift.

When this is our journey, marked by the promises of God, we see that Advent and Christmas have not changed at all. They are as they have always been. And it is to this eternal truth that we hold. While at the same time, it is this eternal truth that holds us. So, let's journey together to Bethlehem to fall in worship before the newborn King.

Though things may be different this year in terms of how we hold Advent and Christmas, Advent and Christmas are still the same. I am excited to journey with you to Bethlehem. I am excited to center in on the Christ-child with you. I am excited to be holding Advent with you. Please know just how much me and my family love and pray for you and yours.


