From Our Pastor . . .

Our family enjoys the same Sunday evening routine each week. After an afternoon of rest and possible napping, we get ready, load in the car, and drive into Hickory to go through the drive-thru at CookOut. And, we order the same thing. It is the very same routine each and every Sunday evening. The only thing that is subject to change is the length of the drive-thru line. Will it be out into Hwy 127 or not? Will we have to wait in the turn lane or not? You get the picture.

If you have ever eaten CookOut, you know the meal is not complete without a milkshake. So, when we finish placing our order, we make sure there are three milkshakes on the list. Our kids just LOVE those things. It was just a few weeks back when we made our routine Sunday evening trip to pick up supper and we returned home to eat. We sat at the dining room table and talked and laughed and had a good time together. Then, at the end of the meal, Eva said, "OK! TIME FOR MILKSHAKE!" She jumped up ready to get the one they would share together. She said, "Hey, Annlyn.... Hey, Caulder.... Do you want to see my happy milkshake dance?" She didn't wait for them to respond before she started dancing around the kitchen. I thought to myself, "Now, that is some true joy about a milkshake!"

Then I began to reflect on *why* Eva was joyful. Sure, what led to her joy was the fact that she had a milkshake to enjoy with her siblings. But, joy goes deeper than that. Joy is also about trust. From the moment Ronna and I said, "Ok, let's go to CookOut," she knew that meant she would get a milkshake. She trusted what she knew to be true. She knew it to be true by experience week in and week out.

Joy and trust go hand in hand. We are joyful when we trust. We learn to trust by experience. When I saw Eva dancing around the kitchen, I asked myself, "What makes me *that* joyful?" We often say that joy is a central expression of our faith. And why would we not be joyful? God is good...all the time. Jesus is alive. As followers of Christ, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit. Why would we not be joyful? We sometimes have trouble being joyful because we have trouble trusting. We long to keep control rather than trusting that God is good and we can trust in the presence and power of God. We must remember that joy and trust go hand in hand. We will be joyful people when we completely trust the Lord. We learn to trust the Lord through experience; walking with the Lord in the fellowship of His light.

The psalmist has a way of putting this into words we can all understand: Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the Name of the LORD our God" (Psalm 20:7). Where we place our trust is where we trust we will find joy. Joy is the overwhelming feeling that good is coming. As followers of Jesus, our trust is in the Lord and our joy comes from the Lord. If we trust in anything or anyone other than the Lord, we will be disappointed, and the joy will be temporary.

However, the opposite is also true. If we trust in the Lord alone, we will not be disappointed, and the joy will be full and eternal. And we learn to trust the Lord by walking with the Lord. We can count on the Lord. We can depend on the Lord. Our joy will deepen when we take stock to see just how much we can trust the Lord. Take some time in the coming days to write down all the things in your life where the Lord has given you joy and write out how your trust of the Lord led to a deeper and more complete joy.

Where is your trust? What is the source of your joy? These are questions we should all ask ourselves.

By the way....the Oreo milkshake at CookOut is a must-have item on the menu. I don't think you will be disappointed.

It is a joy to walk this faith with you as your pastor and your friend...
