From Our Pastor...

Here we are once again: standing at the starting line of another year. With all the trappings and wonder, possibilities and promises, resolutions and requests, we look ahead into the unknown of 2023. I have always considered the start of a new year to be something remarkable, for we have just come through the season of celebrating the birth of Jesus, the Son of God, the incarnate and "enfleshed" presence of the Almighty One, and then we begin a new year. We go from celebrating a new life to beginning a new year. The newness is all over the place!

To call the story of Christmas "remarkable" always feels like an understatement. To refer to the "wonder of Christmas" always seems to fall short of the depth of miracle that actually took place in Bethlehem in that moment. The moment in time when God descended into creation in order to bring rescue, resurrection, and redemption. Something so new and wonderful happened at Christmas that time and eternity were brought together in a way that had never been before. So, for us to follow up celebrating Christmas with looking at a new year...well, it just makes a lot of sense.

Consider what it must have been like to be in Bethlehem when Jesus was born. There was business and busyness of a small town was taking place while the Son of God drew His first mortal breath. A group of shepherds come into the village, looking for a newborn baby. Imagine the surprise and excitement when they showed up. They had never heard of anything like this before. Ponder the nature of the conversation between Joseph, Mary, the shepherds in that moment. Joseph and Mary each tell the shepherds what happened nine months prior, while the shepherds tell Joseph and Mary what happened just a little bit ago. They wonder and the worship must have been incredible. It changes them all forever. We do not hear any more from the shepherds after they returned to the fields glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen. We barely hear anything else from Mary, let alone Joseph, in the rest of the gospel. But Luke tells us that "treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart" (Luke 2:19).

But the story doesn't end there. There is also the visit of the Magi. Something new happens then too. A new star shines in the sky and a new journey of worship begins. The Magi travel for miles and miles over the course of, possibly, months and months, to reach their destination. Through lots of distraction and diversions, along with a detour through Jerusalem, they keep their eyes on that new star. They follow it all the way to where it leads. Stick with the gospel accounts long enough, through to the end, and you find yourself standing at a torturous cross and an empty tomb. There has just never been anything like this. It is all so new and amazing and full of wonder.

One of the aspects of this entire first chapter of the story of Jesus is how everyone who encounters Jesus leaves different than how they came. Joseph and Mary are both terrified at first. The shepherds are startled beyond description, only to later leave Bethlehem glorifying and praising God. The Magi enter the home where Jesus is and bow down to worship Him. Then, they go home a different way, and as different men. It is a whole new beginning.

Follow this new beginning through and we find time and time again that Jesus gives new life, new beginnings, and births a new hope. Time and again those who encounter this Jesus are changed forever. It is my prayer that as we begin this new year, we too, will find ourselves changed by Jesus. At every turn in this new year may we fall before Him in worship and serve Him as our Lord. It is a beautiful thing this year to see that New Year's Day falls on Sunday. What better way to begin this new year than to gather for worship, to be changed by the presence and move of the Lord, and to look ahead in wonder to what the Lord will do in and through us.


