From Our Pastor . . .

The sun had set at the end of another long day during this season of uncertainty. I found myself standing in a place I have been so many times in the last eight and a half years. It was once again bedtime for the children. When it comes time to tuck in at night, most of the time I take Caulder to his room and Ronna goes with the girls into their room. So, there I stood at Caulder's bed prepared to tuck him in, rub his head one last time, and fist-bump goodnight. But Caulder had other plans. So did the Lord.

Caulder's day was full of play, energy, and fun which meant he was not quite ready to set like the sun. There was still one more game he was ready to play. He stood up on his bed and shouted, "DAD! CATCH ME!" Then, standing on the edge of his bed, he leaned forward. There was nothing to catch him except the arms of his father. That's all he knew. That's all he needed to know. The arms of his father were right there to catch him. He was full of energy which is par for the course of his life. He was also full of trust. Childlike faith. He knew the arms of his father were there and he had complete and unrestrained trust that his dad would catch him.

As his 3 ¹/₂ year old body hit my chest and his arms swung around my neck, the Holy Spirit hit me square in the heart and wrapped around my soul. All of a sudden, the last several weeks came flooding back through my mind like a flash of lightening. All of the news. All of the worry. All of the anxiety. All of the questions. All of the uncertainty. These have been weeks when none of us have known exactly what to do. But one thing remains the same: the arms of our Father are still strong, and we can fall against His chest and feel His beating heart for us. By the prompting of the Holy Spirit's comfort, I began to ask myself if I have been completely trusting the arms of my Father through all of this. Am I trusting He will meet our needs? Am I trusting He will catch us? Am I trusting with childlike faith that the arms are safe and secure and will hold us from all alarms?

Then the questions began to go deeper and reach beyond just the last eight weeks as we have been facing the current crisis in which we all find ourselves. Was I trusting the arms of God before this season of uncertainty? Was I living through childlike faith before this present crisis? How will my life of faith be different after all of this is said and done? You see, the call to live in faith is not a call for a season but for a lifetime. It is not a summons to childlike faith only for the valleys of life but also for the mountaintops and everything in between. When life is scary, we trust God. When life is bright and sunny, we trust God.

I was reminded that night, and every moment since, of the words of the wise teacher of the Old Testament: "*Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and he will make your paths straight*" (*Proverbs 3:5-6*). Just as we trusted God before this current season, I pray we are trusting God during this season, and we will trust God after this season.

It is difficult to put into words – written or spoken – how much I miss our church family being together. As one body. Praising God in one voice. The truth of the matter is we are *still* one body and *still* praising God with one voice. I trust the Lord that we will be back together soon. Until that day comes, and every day after, let us all trust the Lord. Trust the arms of our Father. After all, they are good arms. They are strong arms. Our God is good....all the time!


